

Food Sales are regulated by The Kansas Department of Agriculture. The objective is to ensure all foods offered for the sale are safe and wholesome. A current license is required for food vendors who will be selling potentially hazardous food. The exceptions, for those who do not require a license, are non-profit groups or persons who sell 6 or less events a year.

All vendors are responsible for foods on sale or display to be effectively protected from contamination.

Foods which require no license: Non-potentially hazardous baked goods, such as cookies, breads, cakes, cinnamon rolls, and fruit pies (no products which have cream fillings). Other non-potentially hazardous foods include fresh whole fruits and vegetables, nuts and honey. The only home canned products allowed for sale are jams and jellies.

All food vendors who will be handling potentially hazardous foods must have a set up for hand washing.

Foods which require a license unless you fall under an exempt group: Potentially hazardous foods consist in whole or in part of milk, milk products, eggs, meat, poultry or fish. Examples include: cream or meringue pies, egg rolls, hamburgers and hot dogs, jerky, burritos, summer sausage or similar products
